Other work planned at the Club over the next couple of months or so is the replacement of a large portion of the roof and the painting of the existing roof not being replaced. These projects are delayed work from Covid days and have been budgeted for with the money already put aside.

Our last big project also to commence shortly are improvements to our airconditioning system to further improve air quality in the Club, especially around the pool tables and the dart boards.
